Food on this table is donated free from local supermarkets through the Fareshare Go scheme. While the food may be at, or after the Best Before date, it is still in good condition. Jennifer Henderson is a wonderful point of contact at the table and



is doing a brilliant job of encouraging, signposting to church and the Cosy Hub and generally being an incredibly Big Blessing to everyone who passes by. The work of the Foodstore team is making the nome of Jesus famous on our road... and proclaiming the life and love of our church in the most practical way! Items that are currently in short supply are particularly welcome, these include: 80's teabags, sugar, small coffee jars, tinned fruit, tinned ham, tinned vegetables, dilutable juice, biscuits, and cornflakes.

Thank you to Cooke for supporting and praying for me in my first year!





Investing in the future of Cooke

Each boiler system costs £33000 and we need 3 of them!

Amazingly we have had pledges to cover the cost of 1 and a bit.

Between now and the summer we are hoping to ask the congregation to do all we can to match the pledges in order to start next autumn with an efficient and reliable system.



Over the winter in our morning services, we have been working through one of the most incredible books of the Old Testament. It is a snapshot of the life of a young person called Daniel who lives through a devastating war and then is trafficked to the capital city of the aggressor army. He is forced to change his name and quite probably turned into a eunuch before undergoing intensive re-education in the culture and customs of his captors. There is a lot that seems very contemporary in the power plays and imperial ambitions of the 'great kings' of Babylon that feature in the narrative. Their need to have everyone comply with their dictates- or face ghastly extermination definitely is resonant with Putin's Russia!

As we move beyond the 'lions' den' into the second half of the book of Daniel- we enter the prophetic section. Bizzarre visions of weird beasts, the rise and fall of great empires, war in the heavens. But through all of this there is the echo of confidence- that the God of the fiery furnace & lions' den can be totally depended on. Its an incredible couple of verses in chapter 7 where 600 years before that first Christmas Daniel is given a glimpse of Jesus in his glory: "In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed."

As we meet each other in the challenges of life; illness, broken relationships, disappointments, grief, loss, etc, the hope of Daniel is that his vision of Jesus in his presence and glory is the very same hope that we can also rely on. There is not one minute of our lives- even the hardest seasons- that the Lord does not walk right there beside us. So be encouraged!! Be strong and courageous, keep praying and keep reminding yourself that the God of Daniel has not changed even after almost 3000 years.

Big blessings on you as you seek to love that God and love others with your heart, thinking and practical living.
