The start of a new church year always brings excitement of the possibilities that lie ahead.

The summer of 2024 may not have been remarkable weather wise, but it has been a pretty epic one in the life of Cooke church. We are on our way to a renewed heating system, Roger MacNeill has worked relentlessly to co-ordinate all the work and siting of the boilers- a big job that warrants a big 'thank you' from us all.

An incredible team of 55 volunteers from our church family and beyond staged another fantastic week of Summer Mission. Our theme this year focused on **friendship with God** using a programme that creatively took us diving into the magical underwater world of fish and mammals. **Scuba** was one of my biggest summer highlights. 70 kids came in contact with the wonderful community of our church, and the greatest story ever- that of Jesus and his love. Many of our teenagers formed the heart of the team and it was fantastic to see them recruiting friends, working positively alongside older team members, growing in confidence and ability, having fun and being excited about their faith. Those of the congregation who came to the afternoon tea-party will testify to the joy of their contribution.

Summer mission has significantly added to sense of belonging number, connectedness of our kids and young people and this is so in evidence as Genesis youth fellowship has relaunched, along with Junior Bible Class, Senior Bible Class and Epic. It is a unique and special thing to watch an ease of confidence in the way our teens chat and get involved with the whole church family, from the youngest to the oldest. It reflects and blesses the heart of our Father God to see his people growing in love and unity..... it is the foundation of his kingdom coming. This is indeed the title for our autumn series of sermons (kingdom come) taking a journey into the world changing teaching of Jesus in his sermon on the mount.





We have reintroduced the pew bibles into church alongside highlighters in order to assist us all to engage with and consider what Jesus really says in this sermon. I'm excited as we delve into this and would love to hear about your experiences as we integrate his words into our attitudes and actions.

Life groups relaunch again this month alsowe had so many wonderful evenings together last year and I would really encourage you to come and try one out if you haven't already done so. Its the ideal place to grow and grapple with your faith and to explore how it lands in our lives.

I am delighted also to share news that we will have the Rev Corrina Herron coming to join us for one day of pastoral and discipleship work every week. AN OLYMPIC ADVENTURE WITH THE CARSONS

I Love Paris in the Spring Time.....

Summer holidays can often be long in the waiting, short in the happening and quickly a memory of the past. However, as the autumn term gets underway, I hope it is the case that you are able to look back on some happy (albeit not necessarily warm!!) memories from the change of routine that summer brings.

This summer our family had the joy of spending a week camping on the outskirts of Paris and to share the majority of that time with our very own minister Dave Gray and his lovely family. (Pastoral care is taken very seriously at Cooke PC!!). The focus of our trip was the opportunity to attend the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. Having been successful in the ticket ballot some 18 months before. By the time our trip finally came, the excitement levels where almost as high as the pole vault world record which was later to be broken during the Games.

Our tickets were for one of the afternoon sessions of the men's Rugby Sevens tournament which was taking place in the main Olympic Stadium – Stade de France, the day before the opening ceremony of the Games.

Our day began with an early morning departure from our adjoining tents for a car trip (remembering that they drive on the other side of the road there!) to the train station. After Sheryl and my very own 100 metre Olympic sprint from the ticket office, we all just about made it safely onto the train for central Paris. Once we arrived Jane, drawing on her time living in Paris for a year as a student, joined Sheryl on the leadership team, while I continued to follow the guidance, and the kids began spending all the money!!

We took the Metro and joined with the thousands of other excited fans making our way to the Olympic Stadium. There is always something exhilarating about converging with the crowd to a big event, whether sporting or otherwise. The shared endeavour, the excited anticipation, the buzz of conversation and the noise as a group of people, many unknown to each other, bind together in a shared goal. Heading to my first Olympic Games this was especially so, with so many different nationalities evident and our wonderful Parisian hosts pointing the way with their large sponge fingers. It will come as no surprise to any of you that in the middle of thousands of people from across the world Dave and Jane managed to bump into close family friends from back home!!



Arriving at the Olympic Stadium did not disappoint!! It's multi-tiered stands rising high into the sky, its street vendors selling their wares, every food and drink taste satisfied and the many costume clad French supporters in joyful form. Once inside the rugby action was equally breathtaking as 6 matches were played out back-to-back before us between 12 strong international teams.





Highlights included becoming French for 14 minutes and chanting 'Allez Les Bleus' as France took on Fiji, seeing Australia and South Africa dispatch their opposition with that usual southern hemisphere swagger and Ireland running New Zealand very close before the All Blacks do what they do best and eked out their customary win at the death! In between matches the Gray kids kept us and the entire crowd entertained by popping up on the big screen in the stadium, with Amelie in particular spotted on TV back home. A possible star for the future?!

With the rugby over we joined the many others pouring out of the stadium still chanting 'Allez Les Bleus' (I promise not to do it again once the Six Nations rugby resumes). Jane now became chief tour guide and Sheryl and I happily followed her lead while the young people finished spending all the money!! We were treated to a wonderful tour of all the Paris sites from the Pompidou Centre to Notre-Dame, from dinner on the banks of the River Seine to desserts at the iconic Café de Flore, before finishing on level 2 of Olympic Rings clad Eiffel Tower at 11.30pm, surveying Paris beneath us. Another Olympic sprint followed to catch the last train out of Paris back to our cars and a return journey to our campsite by 3.00am!

To be able to attend the Olympic Games in Paris in 2024 was particularly special for us all as it marked 100 years since Eric Liddell's attendance in the same city for the 1924 Olympic Games. In a story made famous by the film Chariots of Fire, Eric Liddell, the world's best sprinter from Scotland, withdrew from the 100 metres race, in the face of strong opposition from the public, officials and teammates alike. This was because the race heats took place on a Sunday when his own convictions didn't allow him to run on a Sunday. Ultimately Liddell entered the 400 metres instead, a race he was not expected to win, transforming how it was run and winning it in a new Olympic record. I would thoroughly recommend watching Chariots of Fire (again!!). But it tells only part of his remarkable Christian life story, and I would also highly recommend any of his biographies.

What I love most about Eric Liddell's story however is the moment he explains his motivation for running as follows:

'God made me fast and when I run, I feel His pleasure'

Not many of us can be as fast Eric Liddell or as good at sports as the Olympic athletes we see, but one thing that I am certain of and that every one of us can have in common with Eric Liddell is to feel God's pleasure each and every day when we seek to follow Him, wherever He has placed us. His Word promises:

'The Lord your God is with you, he is mighty to save. He will take great delight in you, he will quiet you with his love, he will rejoice over you with singing' (Zephaniah 3:17)

NEW HEATING SYSTEM UPDATE



COOKE, WE HAVE IGNITION!

Over the summer there has been a significant move forward in the replacement of the heating system for the church building and hall complex. We have fully working gas boilers now operational in the main halls and MacMillan Halls. The church building has had to have assessments on where best to locate the significant connections of boilers, pumps and pipework, but this is now decided and the engineers are poised to start installation. Meanwhile the money to fund this vital work has wonderfully been invested by members of the congregation. Thank you! We have raised enough to meet the £82K bill so far with the final unit to be paid for once installed and operational. Already the efficiency of the new systems is transforming the level, speed and cost of heating in the halls, and we look forward to this being extended to our church building before winter sets in. Our fund raising target only has £20K to go- lets work together to complete the miracle!
